Population of Albemarle County, and Charlottesville

At the time of the 2000 census, the population of Albemarle County was approximately 84,186. It is estimated that the County's July 2008 population is 94,075. Charlottesville's population is about 42,000

Local Attractions

Albemarle County boasts many historic attractions, such as James Monroe's Ash-Lawn Highland, the historic Michie Tavern, and Thomas Jefferson's Monticello.

Albemarle County also boasts many recreational activities, which include mountain bike trails, boating, hiking trails/greenways, golf courses, swimming. Two of the nearby parks are Beaver Creek Lake, with a 104 acre lake and 115 acres of land, and Mint Springs Valley Park, with 502 acres of land and 8 acres of water with two beaches.

Driving Directions/Distances

Greenwood is approximately 30 minutes west from Charlottesville, an hour from Richmond or Lynchburg, just under 30 minutes from Waynesboro, about 1 hour from Harrisonburg, nearly 2 hours from Roanoke, nearly 2 hours to Fredericksburg, and just under 3 hours from Washington, D.C.
